I hope this email finds you well! I recently recorded an insightful webinar titled **"How You Can Get Cheaper Vet Drugs"**, and I wanted to share some key takeaways with you. If you're looking to save on veterinary medications, this is a must-watch!

Key Points from the Webinar:

- Conflict of Interest in Medication Dispensing:**
 - Veterinarians often face a conflict of interest as they profit from selling medications directly, similar to if your medical doctor profited from prescribing your heart medication.
- Provincial Barriers in Canada:**
 - In most provinces, pharmacists can't buy medications directly from manufacturers due to restrictions, giving veterinarians control over pricing.
 - Quebec is an exception, where pharmacies can purchase directly, leading to competitive pricing. Is this where we should be going?
- Strategies for Saving Money:**
 - Consider asking if your pet's medication can be dispensed through a human pharmacy, which might offer a cheaper alternative.
 - Explore pharmacies on the Internet, though be cautious as they are not heavily regulated in Canada.
- Impact of Corporations:**
 - Large corporations often set prices across their networks, reducing competition and keeping prices high.
- Future Changes:**
 - The Competition Bureau in Canada is reviewing these practices, and changes may be on the horizon.

What You Can Do:

- **Ask Questions:** When prescribed a medication, inquire if it can be filled at a human pharmacy or through an Internet-based pharmacy.
- **Stay Informed:** Keep an eye on regulatory changes that might affect medication pricing.
